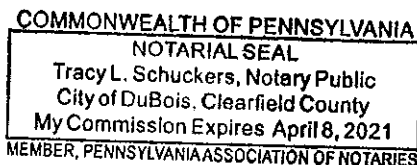

The Township of Sandy intends to submit an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for Federal Fiscal Year FFY 2019. The FFY 2019 funding allocation will be \$156,959.

CDBG funds can be used for a variety of community development purposes by the Township of Sandy, such as public improvements (water, sewer, sidewalks, street reconstruction, recreation, etc.), rehabilitation of deteriorated housing units, the removal of architectural barriers to the elderly or physically challenged, the mitigation of blighted/slum areas, energy conservation projects, etc. At least 70% of the funds must be used to benefit low-to-moderate income persons.

An eligible project must meet one of the three National Objectives: project must benefit low-to-moderate income persons, aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight, and/or address an immanent health or safety threat. In the event these activities will demolish or convert and low-to-moderate housing units, the units will be replaced on a one-on-one basis by type, condition and location. However, the displacement of persons as a result of projects selected will be avoided to the greatest extent possible.

The Township of Sandy will hold two public hearings. Public hearing no. 1 will begin at 6:30p.m. on Monday, July 15, 2019, at the Sandy Township Municipal Building, 1094 Chestnut Avenue, DuBois, PA 15801.

The purpose of the hearing is to offer citizens an opportunity to provide input into the development of Sandy Township's needs. A presentation will be made on the CDBG program, including eligibility requirements. Interested organizations and individuals will be given the opportunity to offer suggestions for the development of Sandy Township's 2019 CDBG application and its Three-Year Plan (2019-2021). The public will also be afforded the opportunity to secure information regarding the prior uses of CDBG funds. A separate public hearing will be held to discuss and approve the application prior to submittal to DCED.

The location of the hearing is accessible to persons with disabilities. If special accommodations are needed for persons with disabilities, those with hearing impairments, or those in need of translation from English, those persons should contact Shawn Arbaugh by phone at (814) 371-4220, by email at sarbaugh@sandytownship.net, or by mail at P.O.
